The majority of guided tours of châteaux end with a tasting, usually free and without any obligation to buy. Breathing the scent of an Armagnac right next to the still, inhaling a wine's rich aroma in the cool semidarkness of a wine cellar – these are moments of pure pleasure. Maisons des vins often offer their own tasting sessions, where you can sample a range of wines from the region in the company of professional wine experts. In the Haute-Gironde region, at the Maison du vin de Blaye - Côtes de Bordeaux and the Maison du Vin des Côtes de Bourg, wine tasting is free for individual visitors. The Maisons du vin of the Entre-deux-Mers, Graves, Sauternes and Monbazillac regions also offer free tastings. And there is no better way to learn about the art of matching wines to different foods than by stopping off in one of the region's countless restaurants or inns.

Wine Bars

Contemporary and chic, wine bars give you the opportunity to sample wines from all over the region, but above all from local cuvées. More often than not they are accompanied by a little appetizer: foie gras, Bayonne ham or other Basque meats, or sometimes even chocolate!

Hone your tasting skills in an Ecole du Vin

If you want to know more about wine, an école du vin is undoubtedly the best place to start. Here you can learn how to recognize different appellations and grape varieties, discuss a wine's robe, appreciate the full length of its flavour in the mouth, then identify that final note of fruit or leathery tannins. It all sounds almost poetic, but an hour or two of lessons can teach you the basics, and a course of a day or more will give you a deeper understanding.

In Bordeause, the Interprofession Council for Bordeaux Wines offers a wine education course of «learning by tasting, with a simple and accessible commentary by experts,» all conducted in a pleasant, relaxed environment.

There are a range of activities to try, such as the wine-Sign detector: taste 6 different wines and give your opinions on each, then let the computer analyse your responses to determine your sign. There is also a boutique with a wide range of wines, a bar offering tastings with expert commentary, a restaurant where you can develop your skills in matching wines to food and a 35 acre park complete with picnic areas and dotted with numerous installations by contemporary artists.

Learn the basics at Planète Bordeaux

Twenty minutes outside Bordeaux, on the road to Libourne, is Planète Bordeaux of Bevchac-et-Caillau. This centre dedicated to the wines of Bordeaux and Bordeaux Supérieur is not to be missed. Conceived as a multimedia exhibition centre, this fun-filled exhibition will delight visitors of all ages with its dazzling mix of sounds, colours and images. Planète Bordeaux offers an overview of the whole cycle of wine growing and making, and the first step is Planet Tasting. This tasting game invites you to discover three wines in quick succession, with a gong sounding every ten minutes to tell you when to share your opinions and move onto the next wine: entertaining and educational!

Discover the Armagnac tradition in Ognoas

Le Domaine d'Ognoas, in the Bas-Armagnac region, was founded in the 11th or 12th century, and is home to Gascony's oldest still. You can learn all about Armagnac production, and sample some of the famous eau-de-vie. One of France's oldest appellations, Armagnac is produced from white wines which are naturally distilled then aged in oak barrels.

Golf courses and spa resorts in the region

Some of Aquitaine's most beautiful golf courses are surrounded by vineyards. These courses are also home to the region's best spa resorts, for the perfect combination of sport and well-being. Nowhere is this truer than in the Médoc, with its 36-hole Golf du Médoc. an exceptional resort which ranks among Europe's best courses. The 18-hole Relais de Margaux is another fine course stretching along the bank of the Gironde estuary. Périgord, meanwhile, is home to the 27-hole Golf des Vigiers. This beautiful course, laid out in the grounds of a 16th century château which is now a 4-star hotel, provides an ideal escape in the midst of Bergerac's vineyards.

Other hotels nestled in the vines offer a taste of luxury with their elegant spas. The Maison du Bien-Etre, for example, is one of the four wings of the 4-star Hôtel Spa Grand Barrail, situated in the heart of the Saint-Émilion appellation. And the 5-star Sources de Candalie resort, tucked in between vineyards in the famous Graves region, is home to a «vinotherapy» spa; the first to offer treatments which combine the virtues of spring water and the beneficial properties of vines and grapes.

The wine-making villages


Saint-Estèphe, Saint-Émilion, Pomerol, Pessac-Léognan, Sauternes...

Names which evoke not only famous appellations, but equally beautiful villages...

Saint-Émilion is certainly the most well-known: a medieval town packed with art and history. and classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site along with its famous vineyards. The monolithic church, the only one of its type in the world, is well worth a visit. as are the more than 70 hectares of underground rooms beneath the town: natural cellars where the wines are matured. A special «great vineyards» land train offers tours of the surrounding vineyards and prestigious châteaux: Ausone, Cheval Blanc...



This «Village of Wine and Local Flavour» is home to a dozen quest houses, the Au Baba d'Andréa bakery, the restaurant Café Lavinal and the Bages Bazaar, a boutique dedicated to wine and the art of living. The Ateliers de Bages are a series of galleries gathering together artists and artisan craftsman such as the Nat'Osier basketmaking studio. The village is also the site of the Cordeillan-Bages cookery school, as well as the Cercle Lynch Bages, who welcome wine lovers. Enthusiasts and professionals can discover or learn more about the art of tasting. Courses, days or stays, which combine wine knowledge and lifestyle, are offered there throughout the year by appointment.

Walking through vineyards, architectural walking tours

From medieval castles to rather more recent constructions, châteaux and their wine cellars are often extraordinary buildings. Take for example the legendary

> The Blue Cellar at Château d'Arsac, Médoc in Gironde

Château d'Yquem, Château de La Rivière with its fortifications, the famous Château Margaux with its columns, or the Oriental follies of the Château Cos d'Estournel. Elsewhere, contemporary architects have created ever bolder designs for new wine cellars: take for example Château Lafite-Rothschild at Pauillac, with its vast concrete arena carved 10 metres into the ground. At Château d'Arsac the «blue cellar» is home to a collection of works. by some of the biggest names in contemporary art: Niki de Saint-Phalle, Claude Viallat, Bernard Pagès, Vincent Monthier, Jean-Pierre Raynaud, Bernar Venet. For an entirely contemporary experience, why not visit the Sylvain Dubuisson-designed Château Haut-Selve in Ğraves, an estate founded as recently as 1993. The centrepiece of Haut-Selve is a long rectangular building which seems to emerge from the earth.

Harvest time and the launch day of «vin nouveau» are both great excuses for a party, from Sigoulès in Dordogne to Montfort-en-Chalosse in the Landes. Classic examples of Aquitaine's festive traditions, wine festivals. fairs and markets provide a colourful mixture of gastronomy, local produce and crafts, wine tasting, special shows, brass bands, and plenty of other music and sport. In the south of the Gironde department, Langon's Wine, Bread and Cheese festival attracts more than 20,000 visitors every September.

Wine and fine cuisine are the focus of three days of celebration; «tasting passes» are available, offering visitors the chance to sample a range of wines from all over the region. In the evenings, the riverbank comes alive with a full programme of music and entertainment.

The great centres of wine tourism in Aquitaine organise a variety of festivals, shows and concerts, mostly in the summer months. All of these events are complemented beautifully by the chance to sample a glass of local wine in an enchanting setting, surrounded by vines and old stone architecture. A few of the highlights of this diverse range of events: Bergerac's *Musical Summer*, Les Grandes Heures de Saint-Émilion, the Médoc Summer Music Celebration, Marmande's Lyric Nights and Voices of the World events, Créon's Open Your Voice festival of cycling and music...
